Platforms:

For our platform one of the main things we want to do is continue the open dialogue and communication between the departments. We were able to intercede and mediate conversations between those that were having concerns with one department or another. However, I do feel that there were some times where we did fall short and those are the things we are looking to improve on. One of those being better communication and transparency with the people of San Andreas. While sure, there are things posted by each of the news outlets and things being shared on the government website we believe that we can still provide digestible and somewhat more accessible information to the people in the form of something like fireside chats that in terms of the cadence of them is still to be determined. Being able to share a short form one minute video on twitter and across different media platforms allows easy to come by and quick listening on what is going on currently in the government, including but not limited to things like potential nominees for different head positions, current legislation being worked on, current previously raised questions or issues from open forums being answered or updated on, this way the public is not completely in the dark until the Town Halls and don't feel like they are lost and forgotten about as soon as they aren't seen.

Ultimately, if we were to boil it all down to four words, I listed two above, it would be communication, transparency, efficiency, and consistency.

Communication:

Already touched on above, but we would like to begin producing a short form 1 minute video to be posted on multiple media platforms keeping the people of the state abreast on what is going on that week, or last few weeks within the government. We want to allow questions to be shared and comments as well that we can then try to answer and update in the next video we do. This way the people of the state can feel like they are being heard and the concerns or questions are being handled or answered.

Transparency:

This also ties in with the video idea but we would like to inform the public of the different goings on that we are legally allowed to do so. That being different bills in the works, nominations, and so on. We want the people to know what is going on before it's placed on my desk to sign so they can give their thoughts and concerns or even approvals or improvements to make something better because we are to be making laws, and setting people in place to make the state better for the people that live in it after all.

Efficiency:

Given both of our times in the government, at this point we have served practically a whole year with Gracie serving as Chief of Staff for a year under two different administrations and Damien serving as a State Rep Assistant, then a State Rep, and now Lt. Governor and we believe that with our experience and knowledge of positions we can work together to bring about proper efficiency to getting what is set before us done.

Consistency:

Again due to our knowledge and experience in addition to us bringing in Link Jordins as the Secretary of State once more and Karly Stark as the Chief of Staff we believe that with all four of us working we can bring the consistency needed for this position when it comes to the above three other platform points.

Something we want to make known is that if we are at all drifting in the wrong direction or people feel like they aren't being heard or don't feel like we aren't staying on top of things and providing the communication, transparency, efficiency, or consistency we are looking to provide and claiming we will provide, we want people to reach out to us. Yes, we are going to do our damnedest to stand true to what we say, but we are still human and make mistakes, we get tired, we get burned out and worn down, this job is not easy. We have an open door policy for a reason not only so people know that they have the ability to reach out and talk to us but also because if we're slipping up, we need to know. How can we course correct or fix what was wrong if we don't know something went wrong in the first place. We genuinely just want to do our best to try to make the state overall more enjoyable to live in for everyone living within it.
